
Your cart awaits: It's not too late to sign up for the annual CalAPA golf tournament Sept. 20 at the Pacific Palms Resort.



→ I-5 pothole sends cars careening, but SB1-funded help is on the way

Earlier this month a national transportation research group, TRIP, released a report underscoring the cost to each motorist of poorly-maintained roads in California -- up to \$3,000 per driver in some cases. *Asphalt Insider* coverage of the report is [HERE](#).

Just a few weeks later, a yawning pothole on Interstate 5 near Sacramento drove home the point, disabling more than 20 cars and creating a massive morning commute traffic tie-up as tow trucks and CHP officers worked to clear the mess. Fortunately, no injuries were reported. One report of the incident, including links to video clips, can be found [HERE](#).

The broken pavement required emergency repairs and reduced lanes, which stretched into this past weekend. For motorists tallying up the damage to their vehicles, ranging from flat tires, bent rims and cracked oil pans, the connection between bad roads and their pocketbooks couldn't be clearer.



The pothole on I-5 near Sacramento disabled more than 20 vehicles and caused a massive morning commute traffic jam that made the local TV news, including this footage from KXTV Ch. 10.

The silver lining of the otherwise harrowing tale carried live on local TV and radio stations is that help is on the way in the form of a major pavement rehabilitation project scheduled for that section of interstate that will employ long-life (perpetual) asphalt pavement designs.

Road-repairs such as the I-5 rehabilitation are occurring in every county of the state thanks to SB1, the \$5 billion-per-year Road Repair & Accountability Act of 2017, which was passed by a two-thirds majority vote of the Legislature and signed into law by the governor. Voters this past June, by an 80 percent ratio, endorsed a ballot measure to ensure those funds are used solely for transportation-related purposes.



STAY INFORMED

Fixing the roads will be on the ballot again Nov. 6 in the form of Proposition 6, which would repeal the fuel taxes and other fees devoted to road repairs. Public works officials say thousands of road-repairs designed to avoid a repeat of the I-5 catastrophe would be stopped or delayed if Prop. 6 is not defeated. First-responders who are called to the scene of such accidents, have come out in opposition to the measure. They join a broad coalition that includes business and labor, environmental protection and social justice groups opposing Prop. 6.
